


We have had a busy schedule since our first newsletter November 2016. During this time, we have continued to work with our existing partners, and began to work with some new ones. We continue to reach out to additional new organizations to identify their needs and determine how we can best support them.... while maximizing the use of our resources.



We have also continued our research into the reading proficiency of children from low income families. In 2013, an extensive study was done, titled "A Governor's Guide to Early Literacy". It reenforced what many other studies have shown... "a critical benchmark of success is whether students are reading proficiently by the end of the third grade. Unfortunately, only one-third of America's fourth graders are reading proficiently. Students who are not reading on grade level by this point will only fall further behind their peers, and they have a much higher risk of dropping out of high school. The drop out risk is highest for struggling readers who are poor, and living in neighborhoods of concentrated poverty". Based on all this data (and to quote again from the report... "starting at Kindergarten is too late"...) we have narrowed our focus of providing books primarily to children from Pre-Kindergarten to third grade.

Unconventional...Maybe But it Seems to Be Working!

In an effort to reach as many of these children as possible, we are willing to try unconventional means to reach them. We experimented (successfully, we are glad to say) with a program to provide the Lowell Police with books for their patrol car trunks to take to various children's events... movie nights, playground events, etc. Kids could pick out books to take home, as well as packages containing baseball, football and PokeMan cards... anything that might get them reading.

To date, we have delivered over 2500 books, 3 Chrome Book computers for classroom use, and 35 bikes. Our goal is not to give out lots of books for the sake of giving out books. We want to give out the *right* books! Although we do provide books for various libraries, we have found it to be far more effective to work with our *partners and* their *reading specialists* to *get* the *specific books which they* know will be best for the *children*, based upon their reading levels. Some of the organizations we provided books to were: Billerica's Dutile School; Lowell Head Start program; Lowell's Shaughnessy School; Lowell and Billerica Boys and Girls Clubs; Lowell Girls, Inc., as well as other various agencies.

There are many children in our area who need our help. The cost of books is approximately \$100 for 30 books and helps 5 children maintain their reading levels over the Summer. The cost of one bike set up is approximately \$120, and helps one child with exercise and independence.






